It aims at training students on the following basic skills such as reading and comprehension, vocabulary and grammar as well as the bases of conversation so as students could communicate easily in English and also enable them to process to higher levels of English. <b>(0502100) Communication skills in English Language</b> This course aims at developing students' human communications skills. These skills which will eventually be employed to reinforce certain positive life qualities on them. Students are trained on such skills by different teaching methods whether at individual levels or through teamwork. These skills might also include listening, raising questions, presentations, and other skills that can be already acquired through regular practice. <p><b>(0502203) Reading and Vocabulary Development</b></p> <p>This class will improve students' fundamental reading skills, vocabulary development, reading comprehension, fluency, and interpretation. Extensive opportunities for applying reading strategies for before, during, and after reading will be provided. Critical analysis skills in relationship to various texts will be introduced to guide students toward college level reading. In this course students will work on strengthening their reading and study strategies, developing their reading vocabulary, and improving their test-taking strategies. Students will have the opportunity in this class to develop their reading speed and comprehension of a variety of written materials. <p><b>(0502105) Writing 1</b></p> <p>This course aims at teaching students how to write a coherent and unified paragraph. <b>(0502107) Listening and Conversation</b> The aim of this course is to help students reinforce and extend their listening and conversational skills. This is achieved through providing them with systematic and comprehensive training in the perception and production of English utterances of various types and lengths. Particular attention is given to stress, rhythm, and the more important types of word linking. Formally levels, conversational syntax, and turn-taking rules are also emphasized. High frequency introductory, transitional, and concluding elements of different communicative events should be discussed and intensively drilled so that they may become part of the student's conversational repertoire. <b>(0502206) Writing 2</b> The main objective of this course is to enable students to express themselves coherently in writing. It exposes students' to and gives them practice in extended writing beyond the sentence level, i.e., The course should also focus on the organization of academic writing essays, reports, assignments and projects. <p><b>(0502488) Introduction to Cultural Studies</b></p> <p>This is an introductory level course in cultural studies. Generally considered, cultural studies refers to the notion that the study of cultural processes (the production, circulation, and use of cultural artifacts), especially, though not exclusively, in the context of what is referred to as "popular culture," is theoretically and politically important to an active and productive understanding of the ways in which "power" and "influence" manifest themselves in a social and/or political order. That said, the phrase "cultural studies" is an extremely contested one in contemporary public and academic discourse, and our primary goal in this course will be to examine the range of ways in which we might understand its meaning and attendant implications for how we theorize, interpret, and critique cultural practices. The course will be organized into three primary sections. In the first section we will examine some of the historical roots of cultural studies, primarily in the American and British contexts, with an eye to developing what Foucault might call an "intellectual genealogy" for its practice. In the second section of the course we will examine a number of theoretical and methodological problems and issues that have occupied the concerns of those working in the area of cultural studies over the past twenty-five years. In the final section of the course we will examine four representative, full-length cultural studies as a means of evaluating and assessing how such theoretical and methodological problems are negotiated <i>in situ</i>.
