communication. It is designed to improve writing and speaking skills of students in English in		
order to communicate effectively using English language in diverse social and academic settings.		

(0502104) Principles of English Grammar This course focuses on the basic elements of traditional English grammar, including parts of speech, parts of the sentence, dependent and independent clauses, issues of agreement and consistency, punctuation, and introduction to the basics of diagramming. practical understanding of the fundamentals of grammar through lecture, class discussion, the		
working out of grammatical problems, evaluating various forms of writing, and writing sentences		
and paragraphs.

This class will improve students' fundamental reading skills, vocabulary development,		
reading comprehension, fluency, and interpretation. Extensive opportunities for applying reading		
strategies for before, during, and after reading will be provided. Critical analysis skills in		
relationship to various texts will be introduced to guide students toward college level reading. In		
this course students will work on strengthening their reading and study strategies, developing their		
reading vocabulary, and improving their test-taking strategies. Students will have the opportunity		
in this class to develop their reading speed and comprehension of a variety of written materials.		
Strategies for effective reading and the acquisition of new vocabulary will be introduced in this		
course.		
(0502105) Writing 1	(الكتابة 1)	(0502105)
This course aims at teaching students how to write a coherent and unified paragraph. The course		
should provide students with the necessary techniques to write correct and effective sentences. It		
also aims at teaching students how to observe correct punctuation, how to write topic sentences,

such as, classifying, contrasting, and analyzing, etc., should be addressed.

is achieved through providing them with systematic and comprehensive training in the perception and		
production of English utterances of various types and lengths. Particular attention is given to stress, rhythm,		
and the more important types of word linking. Formally levels, conversational syntax, and turn-taking rules		
are also emphasized. High frequency introductory, transitional, and concluding elements of different		
communicative events should be discussed and intensively drilled so that they may become part of the		
student's conversational repertoire.		
(0502206) Writing 2	(الكتابة 2)	(0502206)
The main objective of this course is to enable students to express themselves coherently in writing.		
It exposes students' to and gives them practice in extended writing beyond the sentence level, i.e.,		
The course should also focus on the organization of academic writing essays, reports, assignments		
and projects.		
(0502150) Grammar	(القواعد)	(0502150)
This course concentrates on grammatical categories; i.e., parts of speech. The noun phrase, verb		
phrase, adjectives and adverbs and prepositions are studied in depth. This course is meant to		
prepare students to the subsequent more advanced course E 321.		
(0502222) Introduction to Linguistics	(مقدمة في اللغويات)	(0502222)
The course aims at acquainting students with the nature of language and its fundamental aspects		
including the basics of phonology, morphology, syntax and semantics.		
(0502352) Phonetics	(الصوتيات)	(0502352)
The aim of this course is to introduce students to the field of general phonetics, speech sound		
production, and description. Emphasis throughout the course will be on the sounds of English and		

suprasegmental features. Students are given ample practice in the language lab.		
(0502255) Syntax 1	(النحو 1)	(0502255)
This course aims at familiarizing students with the linguistic theory focused on the study of the		
structure of English sentences comprising elements of grammatical analysis, noun phrases, verb		
phrases, adjectival phrases, adverbial phrases, and prepositional phrases.		
(0502359) Semantics	(علم المعاني)	(0502359)
The first part of this course is an introduction to the study of semantics on both word and sentence		
level. The second part gives insights into theories of language use, particularly the part of pragmatic		
dealing with how you communicate more than you literally say or write.		
After completing this course you will have:		
 developed an understanding of the relationship between language and meaning on word 		
sentence and utterance level;		
 learned semantic theories about the understanding of different aspects of meaning in words 		
how they can be described, and how grammar and syntax contribute to meaning;		
 learned pragmatic theories about how language users achieve their goals in verbal interaction 		
with others.		
(0502550) Phonology	(الفونولوجي)	(0502550)
This course provides an in-depth introduction to the phonetics and phonology of human languages.		
It aims at helping students identify different speech sounds by their acoustic and articulatory		
properties. students will also be taught about the function of sound system to know more about the		
phonemes, the distinctive features, and phonological operations such as ellipsis, addition,		
assonance, inversion, stress, and intonation.		
(0502466) Socio linguistics	(علم اللغة الاجتماعي)	(0502466)
This course aims at studying language in its social and cultural contexts. It also aims at providing		

students with a general introduction to this branch of linguistics, the different varieties of language		
and their social-cultural values, the inter relationships among language, culture, thought, etc.		
(0502469) Discourse Analysis	(تحليل الخطاب اللغوي)	(0502469)
The course will introduce students to major kinds and levels of procedures of discourse analysis. It		
will explore issues such as Goff man's communication theory, Vygotsky's activity theory, speech		
act theory, conversational analysis, politeness theory, and other pragmatic theories. Students will		
have the opportunity to explore such theories and issues through reading and analyzing classic and		
current articles gaining practice in analyzing real language data and dealing with common research		
problems enabling them to initiate their own discourse analysis. Students will be required to write		
short reports and have in- class presentations and discussions about their works.		
(0502170) Introduction to Literature	(مقدمة في الأدب)	(0502170)
The aim of this course is to introduce students to the concept and definition of "literature", literary		
terms and to the four major genres: poetry, fiction, drama and essay. Moreover, selections of short		
stories, poems, one play and essays are studied and analyzed.		
(0502273) Short Story	(القصة القصيرة)	(0502273)
The course is intended to introduce students to the short story as a genre fiction. At least, ten short		
stories by British, American, or other authors, will be selected to represent different techniques		
themes and subjects. Students are required to select a short story (not discussed in the classroom		
and explore it critically by analyzing its point of view, narrative technique, character, setting, theme		
style, etc.		
(0502287) Poetry 1	(الشعر 1)	(0502287)
This course aims to introduce students to representative poetry by major British and American		
poets. Various verse selections are studied and analyzed. Moreover, it emphasizes poetic language,		
which is compressed and elevated beyond ordinary common discourse. Students will be asked to		

analyze and examine elements like subject matter, technique and style. Attention is to be directed		
toward speaker, imagery, diction, symbolism, theme, figurative language, mood and tone.		
(0502386) Novel 1	(الرواية 1)	(0502386)
The aim of this course is to introduce students to the history, development and types of the British		
novel from the beginning until 19th century. They should also be able to identify and recognize the		
characteristic features of the novelists studied in the course. This course pays special attention to		
the differences in temper, sensibility and techniques used by different writers		
(0502389) Drama1	(المسرحية 1)	(0502389)
This course is intended to familiarize students with the basic elements of drama (dialogue,		
characterization, action, plot, etc.). Students will be required to study at least four plays one		
classical play, one Shakespearean play, and some other three English and American plays.		
(0502487) Literary Criticism	(النقد الأدبي)	(0502487)
The course focuses on critical theory as it applies to literature and culture. Review of classical		
Greek origins of issues concerning the nature of literature and criticism. Study of major twentieth-		
century theories and applications: historical, formalist, archetypal, psychoanalytic, Marxist, reader-		
response, New Historicist, feminist, postcolonial, American multicultural, structuralist and various		
post-structuralist perspectives.		
(0502198) History of English Literature 1	(تاريخ الأدب الإنجليزي 1)	(0502198)
Surveys major works from the Middle Ages and Renaissance. May include Old and Middle		
English texts in translation: Beowulf or Sir Gawain and the Green Knight, alongside works by		
major authors including Chaucer, Shakespeare, Marlowe, Sidney, Spenser, Donne and Milton.		
Surveys major works from the end of the English Civil War period through the 18th century.		
Covers important genres (epic, satire, drama, novel, lyric) and aesthetic tendencies both neo-		
classical and modern. Authors may include Milton, Behn, Defoe, Swift, Pope, Goldsmith,		

Johnson, Fielding, Richardson, Burney, Walpole, Blake, Wordsworth and Coleridge.		
(0502481) Major Author	(مؤلف علم)	(0502481)
This is a general course intended primarily to introduce students to a single author's life, age		
contribution		
to and influence in English literature. Major works representing literary merits and development ar		
selected for study and analysis. Students are required to write a paper analyzing and criticizing		
certain literary issues in an individual work by a certain author.		
(0502489) Comparative Literature	(الأدب المقارن)	(0502489)
The aim of this course is to introduce students to basic concepts of comparative literature. The		
course specifically focuses on the study of literary influences and other elements. At least two		
works from two different literatures are studied. One author's work or a collection of short works,		
of course, in English translation, from French, Spanish, German, Italian, or Russian is required to		
be studied and compared to an English or an American work. Students are expected to study and		
conduct a comparative analysis of these two authors' works.		
(0502280) American Literature	(المدخل إلى الأدب الأمريكي)	(0502280)
This is a survey course designed to introduce students to selected prose and poetry by major American		
writers from the beginnings of American literature to the end of the 19 th century. The course also focuses		
on the sermon tradition, slave narratives and the emergence of national literature. Students should be		
introduced to novelists as Cooper, Hawthorne, Irving, Twain, Melville, James, Howells and poets like		
Bradstreet, Taylor, Freneau, Poe, Whitman and Dickinson—as examples.		
(0502190) Translation 1	(الترجمة 1)	(0502190)
The aim of this course is to introduce students to the basic principles and techniques of translation		
with simultaneous training on translation from Arabic into English and vice versa. Texts to be		
translated are to reflect various types of registers and styles. Students are expected to translate		
particular texts in class and out at home.		

(0502393) Translation 2	(الترجمة 2)	(0502393)
This course is a continuation of Translation (I), but it is of more advanced nature. In this course,		
students are exposed to different registers and styles, scientific, military, journalistic, technical and		
literary. Class exercises and home assignments include translation of a number of passages of		
various length and critiques of translations.		
(0502468) Writing a Research Paper	(كتابة ورقة بحث)	(0502468)
This aim of the course is to give students an advanced training in writing. It is designed as a guide		
to write a formal (term) paper either on a linguistic or literary topic. The outline of course includes		
information about the following topics: the parts of the paper (introduction, body, conclusion and		
references), the use of abbreviations and numbers, spelling and punctuation, stylistic matters like		
capitalization, underlining, etc., presentation of quotation, tables, illustrations, graphs, etc., and		
footnoting. Students are also trained on selecting a topic, narrowing the scope of the paper,		
searching for related material and references, and in synthesizing collected information about the		
topic. Students are encouraged to write a five-page report and a twelve to fifteen-page research		
paper on a specific topic which requires them to research for sources in the library.

(0502357) Advanced Grammar	(القواعد المتقدمة)	(0502357)
This course concentrates on grammatical categories. Parts of speech, the noun phrase, verb		
phrase, adjectives and adverbs, and prepositions will be studied in depth.		
(0502462) Schools of Linguistics	(مدارس علم اللغة)	(0502462)
The course aims at surveying the various schools of the linguistic theory: Structuralism,		
Functionalism, Transformational Gerative Grammar, Relational Grammar, Generalized Phrase		
Structure Grammar, Lexical Functional Grammar, etc. Students are required to write a term-paper		

and to analyze one aspect of any language within the framework of one of these schools.		
(0502358) History of the English Language	(تاريخ اللغة الإنجليزية)	(0502358)
Is a study of basic diachronic changes in the phonology of English, as well as in the syntactic,		
lexical, and semantic structures (of English) from 900 A.D. down to modern times.		
(0502467) Psycho linguistics	(علم اللغة النفسي)	(0502467)
The aim of this course is to study the relationship between language and the brain. The course		
introduces students to the theories of the production and acquisition of language by children and		
adults as related to the human brain mechanisms as well as to the research on these issues. The		
practical part of this course may include the following:		
Showing documentary films illustrating research done on the subject such as films on laboratory		
experiments on brain lateralization, aphasic people, etc.		
Asking students to conduct a mini field research on related topics such as the relationship between		
left-or-right-handedness and ear preference, acquisition of certain aspects of English language, etc.		
(0502350) Syntax 2	(نحو 2)	(0502350)
The aim of this course is to study English complex sentences thoroughly. The clausal system of		
English and the processes of subordination, co-ordination, sentence connection and ellipsis are		
emphasized. Students are required to solve a number of syntactic problems.		
(0502204) Reading 2	(القراءة 2)	(0502204)
The aim of this course is to help students identify different types of reading skills required for		
different reading situations. The course also will focus on developing intensive reading skills		
through examination of text contents and identifying the main ideas and making summaries of the		
texts.		
(0502360) Special Topic in Linguistics	(موضوع خاص في اللغة)	(0502360)
An advanced course in English language or general linguistics.		

(0502364) Language Error Analysis	(تحليل الأخطاء اللغوية)	(0502364)
The aim of this course is to introduce students to the major views representing the Error-Analysis		
approach to language learning. This introduction is achieved through reading a selection of		
original articles. Students are trained to identify, label and account for errors produced by		
Jordanian and Arab students learning English through investigating plausible sources of errors.		
Towards the end of the course, class members are expected to hand in a report summarizing the		
results of a piece of relevant research.		
(0502488) Introduction to Cultural Studies		
This is an introductory level course in cultural studies. Generally considered, cultural studies refers		
to the notion that the study of cultural processes (the production, circulation, and use of cultural	(Thistien Late teacher)	(0502400)
artifacts), especially, though not exclusively, in the context of what is referred to as "popular	(المدخل إلى الدراسات الثقافية)	(0502488)
culture," is theoretically and politically important to an active and productive understanding of the		
ways in which "power" and "influence" manifest themselves in a social and/or political order. That		
said, the phrase "cultural studies" is an extremely contested one in contemporary public and		
academic discourse, and our primary goal in this course will be to examine the range of ways in		
which we might understand its meaning and attendant implications for how we theorize, interpret,		
and critique cultural practices. The course will be organized into three primary sections. In the first		
section we will examine some of the historical roots of cultural studies, primarily in the American		
and British contexts, with an eye to developing what Foucault might call an "intellectual		
genealogy" for its practice. In the second section of the course we will examine a number of		
theoretical and methodological problems and issues that have occupied the concerns of those		
working in the area of cultural studies over the past twenty-five years. In the final section of the		
course we will examine four representative, full-length cultural studies as a means of evaluating		
and assessing how such theoretical and methodological problems are negotiated in situ. By the end		

of the semester class participants should feel comfortable discussing the problems and issues		
central to those operating under the rubric of cultural studies, as well as to putting their own		
scholarly work into a critical and theoretical dialogue with a cultural studies perspective.		
(0502351) Morphology	(علم الصّرف)	(0502351)
This course covers the words, how they are formed, and their relationship to other words in the		
same language. It introduces students to morphemes and its characteristics. It also analyzes the		
structure of words and parts of words, such as stems, root words, prefixes, and suffixes.		
Morphology also looks at parts of speech, intonation and stress, and the ways context can change a		
word's pronunciation and meaning.		
(0502355) Pronunciation and Speech	(النطق والتكلم)	(0502355)
The first half of the course aims at offering a brief introduction to phonetics followed by training		
sessions on the recognition, production, description and transcription of the sounds of English. The		
second half aims at training students on how to enunciate English utterances in terms of stress,		
rhythm and intonation. Students are required to listen to selected cassettes either at home, in the		
classroom or in the language lab.		
(0502490) Technical Translation	(الترجمة التقنية)	(0502490)
This course features the translation from English into Arabic of a variety of special purposes texts		
for an audience of specialists. Student translators are to become conversant with formal,		
functional, conceptual, and stylistic features of discourse genres and technical texts in general or in		
certain fields.		
(0502365) Language Acquisition	(اكتساب اللغة)	(0502365)
The aim of this course is to survey some background information related to current research in		
second language acquisition (SLA). The topics in this course may include theories of SLA, the		
Contrastive Hypothesis, Error Analysis, factors affecting SLA (e.g., age, critical period,		

motivation, personality, first language, neurological aspects, etc.,) strategies of language learning,		
and the contribution of SLA research to language teaching. Students are required to hand in a term		
paper on a relevant topic.		
(0502354) Verb in English Language	(الفعل في اللغة الإنجليزية)	(0502354)
The course aims at studying the English verb system thoroughly: tense, aspect, phase,		
continuatives, phrasal and prepositional verbs, verb complementation, and modal auxiliaries.		
Students are required to write a paper on a topic that is relevant to the study of the English verb.		
(0502496) Drama 2	(المسرحية 2)	(0502496)
This is a second course on drama intended to familiarize students with the basic elements of drama		
(dialogue, characterization, action, plot, etc.). Students will be required to study at least five		
English and American from different periods. New plays are introduced each semester.		
(0502495) Novel 2	(الرواية 2)	(0502495)
The aim of this course is to introduce students to 19 th century British and American Novels and		
novelists. The course will lay special emphasis on differences in temper, sensibility and techniques		
used by different writers. Students are expected also be able to identify and recognize the		
characteristic features of the novelists studied in the course.		
(0502494) Poetry 2	(الشعر 2)	(0502494)
Building on the elements students have had in poetry 1, this course introduces students to the		
most significant poems since Beowulf. Apparently students will use what they learned in Poetry 1		
to develop understanding and appreciation of poems. There must be introductory comments to the		
selected poems which fall into two sections: brief biographical outline of important events in the		
poet's life; and secondly, some general remarks about the main themes of the poet's work and time.		
Selected poems should be representative of the literary periods during which they were written.		
(0502442) Shakespeare	(شكسبير)	(0502442)

This course is intended primarily to introduce students to Shakespeare's life, age, contribution to and		
influence on English literature. Four plays representing Shakespeare's literary merits and development are		
selected for study and analysis. These respectively represent the histories, Roman plays, tragedies,		
romances and comedies. Students are required to write a paper on one of the plays and to discuss its		
language, imagery or characters.		
(0502382) Special Topic in Literature	(موضوع خاص في الأدب)	(0502382)
This course is intended to provide students with an in-depth study of a particular literary genre,		
period, author, movement, or topic. Students are expected to participate fully in the discussions.		
A relatively long paper, seven to ten pages, is to be handed in showing the students' command of		
the basic theme, development, and bibliography related to his or her topic of choice.		
(0502285) Introduction to Literary Analysis This introductory course for literary studies majors focuses on specific literary genres in order to	(مقدمة في التحليل الأدبي)	(0502285)
examine how authors use the literary form to make sense of their world. Students will learn the		
analytical skills of close reading, literary interpretation, and how to build a text-based argument in		
order to uncover meaning found in literary texts. This course is an introduction to literary analysis		
and will introduce students to the skills necessary for literary scholarship.
